A word from the pastor....

Nothing clears the mind like two weeks in the Cayman Islands; doing nothing but reading (7 who-dun-it novels) and meeting at 11:30 in the surf in order to discuss the restaurant for the evening meal. It was a wonderful vacation and it really did provide me with the proverbial "rest and relaxation." Now what? Those were the first words that I found myself asking as the plane landed at IAH. I am home. I was able to enjoy time with my grandchildren and, oh yes, enjoy time with their parents as well, but now what happens.

As I read an article by *Outlook* editor Dr. Jill Duffield, I began to think about the upcoming season of stewardship and what we, as the church, are called to do as Good Stewards of God's gracious call to discipleship. In her words, we are called to "guard the good treasure entrusted to us and exercise our faith, no matter how small, in ways that upend the status quo."

Dr. Duffield calls us to rejoice in the gift of Jesus Christ, knowing we are saved by faith, a faith that has the power to transform creation when we recognize the great debt Christ paid for us and extending that mercy to others, over and over and over again. Imagine the state of the world if our default position was one of grace rather than judgment, mercy rather than retribution, forgiveness rather than punishment, faith rather than cynicism? **Yes**, my friends, just imagine if we were to default to a position of grace rather than judgement; oh, and then why not let your imagination run wild and imagine if we were to look at the world with our hearts full of faith and release the spirit of cynicism that so often pervades our thoughts?

As I read the lyrics offered by John Lennon in his song *Imagine*, I realized I do not necessarily want to imagine a world without heaven or hell or religion or even countries, but I do think that imagining a world where those issues do not divide us, now that is something to "Imagine."

How does all of this have anything to do with stewardship you are probably asking by now? I feel that as Good Stewards of God's gracious call to discipleship, we are called into ONE kingdom. We are to be present in the lives of those around us who are suffering and are unable to find the grace offered by Christ. We can use our considerable resources to bring about spirits of grace, mercy, forgiveness, and faith. May we also allow others to find space in their lives to serve because we are there to lift them up in a myriad of ways. For me that is being good stewards of God's abundance.

As we approach this season of stewardship let's do so thinking of our giving as a time to focus on making new disciples and strengthening those actively following Jesus to grow in the relationship that already exists. I pray that just as the letter from the Stewardship Committee suggests, "The goal of our stewardship ministry is to help God's people grow in their relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and finances God has entrusted to each of us." Let's be the ONE kingdom in Jesus Christ that we are called to be, now and forever, Imagine that....

"The goal of our stewardship ministry is to help God's people grow in their relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and finances that God has entrusted to each of us."





Presbyterian Women Horizons Circle



Over the next month or so, you're going to hear a lot about our 6th Annual Golf Tournament and Dinner as we raise funds for youth mission and ministry here at APC. Many of you know the funds are used to offset the costs of mission and ministry for youth to participate in various activities and mission experiences, but I thought an article, which was published in the local paper of Nederland, CO, may highlight more of the work we did in Colorado last summer. The trip last summer was so impactful on our youth and adults who went last summer, that just days after Summer 2020 dates came out, we sent in our deposit and registration forms for next summer. Yes, we put down a deposit for a trip in July 2020 in September 2019 because of how much this experience meant to the youth and adults who went and because spaces fill quickly! We are grateful for the continued support of youth mission and ministry from the congregation, and look forward to another great experience with Nederland Community Presbyterian Church and Rocky Mountain Mission.



We are going to need all of the support we can get this year since we plan to fly instead of drive to our destination next summer. Many of you may recall that we had multiple vehicle issues last summer and the adults who went were incredibly tired on the way home, which made the trip a challenge.

With all of that being said, our goal is to ask youth to pay no more than \$400 each to attend this trip, which we estimate will actually cost about \$800 per person after registration fees, food, airfare, car rental, and fuel in Colorado are added.

Another way to help the youth achieve this mission is by entering the golf tournament on Sunday, November 3. If you aren't a golfer, join us for dinner. If neither golf nor dinner with the golfers interest you, please consider sponsoring a hole. There are 18 holes. That's 18 opportunities for your participation!

In order for APC to cover 50% of the cost of this trip and our two conferences, we need to raise at least \$3,500 in this tournament through golfers, dinners, and sponsors. If we can get 32 golfers and 18 holes sponsored, we will beat that goal! Join us on November 3 for an afternoon of fun and fellowship while supporting a great cause.


