A word from the pastor...

As we approach the six-month anniversary of the church building's closure, we are thankful for several unexpected blessings: how worship has grown and evolved; how we have been able to become even more inclusive of friends and family, and how family members from many other places have joined us on a regular basis. Now, after much prayer and discussion, the Weekly Worship Team and the Session have decided it is time to resume in-person worship. This does not mean "open the doors wide." We will follow recommended health guidelines. At first, we will have a maximum of 50 people in worship (25% capacity) and we will require registration for each spot. Registration instructions will be available soon. **VERY IMPORTANT: Live streamed worship will continue!**

We have made plans, refined those plans, and edited the refinements. Yet even with all our efforts, the plans remain a work in progress. We want to be thorough and safe. At this time, we are planning to begin in-person worship on Sunday, September 13, at 10:30 am. We will be sending information by email, Narthex News, and Facebook. Our deacons will make calls to their families. We do not want anyone to miss or not understand what is happening.

The worship team and Session have tried to anticipate all the challenges, hopes and dreams that may or may not happen.

As we navigate these uncharted (at least by us) waters, please be patient. We welcome and encourage suggestions. The one immediate need we have is for ushers. If you feel this is something you could do, please email Carroll at the church office (apc@apchumble.org) and she will add you to the list. We will be contacting those who volunteer in the next few weeks. We want to ensure we have enough individuals to help everyone find a physically-distant seat in order to safely participate in worship. There are a few areas that will feel very different:

- We will not have worship bulletins. Everything will be on the screens. However, if you want to download the bulletin to your phone or tablet, it will be on the web site by Friday, prior to the Sunday service.
- Everyone must wear a mask, with no exceptions. We have masks available if you do not have one.

- We have touchless hand sanitizers at the entrances and exits and we ask that you use them when you enter and exit the building.
- We will not sing as a congregation, although Joe and Carl will continue to provide music along with others they might ask to sing solos. I have been in worship with Joe for a few weeks now and I sing along with every hymn--just not out loud. I have learned to lip sync. Actually, I sound pretty good with Joe's voice.
- There are no Bibles, hymnals, or friendship pads in the sanctuary.
- We will not pass the peace.
- We will not pass the offering plate, but a plate will be provided in the narthex for your offering.
- The nursery will not be available and children and youth Faith Formation will not meet in-person for the time being.
- In keeping with safety concerns, restrooms will only be available for emergency use.

Please, carefully review the risks to you and to others before attending in-person worship. Stay home if you feel uncomfortable with the risks of becoming infected by COVID-19. Stay home if you or someone in your household is showing signs of an illness or has been exposed to someone suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19.

In closing, a scripture has been running through my mind over and over: "I can do all things through Christ, who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13. This time is hard: it is hard for us as a church and it is hard for us as individuals. While going back to in-person worship may not be hard, it will be different. Let's joyfully and passionately worship our Lord, whether we do so in person or at home!

To all the members of Atascocita Presbyterian Church:

We pray that you, your family, and your friends are staying safe during these frightening times of Covid-19, social unrest, and political turmoil. During these times, the staff and session of APC have been trying to be “physically distant, socially connected.”

While we have not been meeting in person to give that needed handshake, hug, or word of encouragement, we have attempted to maintain the spirit of the church through remote worship, business meetings, and social interaction. Although we have not been using the physical building of the church, the expenses of Atascocita Presbyterian Church, are for the most part fixed costs and continue on without our physical presence. As you are all acutely aware, APC depends upon the fulfillment of your pledge and the generosity of visitors and guests to maintain our outreach programs and physical operations. Without physically meeting in person it is easy to overlook the “passing of the plate” since we were not really there to be reminded.

So far during the first seven months of the year ended July 31, 2020, donations have been received as follows:


We have been working to keep all expenses at a minimum but have also faced some unusual items of financial concern:

Unbudgeted items	\$4,140	Due to expenses for carpet & furniture cleaning due to pandemic and legal fees to ensure Waste Management contract cancellation.
Roof-anticipated	Repair - 9,000 Replace - 90,000	Numerous roof leaks are being experienced in the "old" building with every rain. We expect to make repairs NOT replace.
Air Conditioner (2)	Replace 14,000	Two of the a/c units in the "old" building needed new compressors and other repairs. These have been completed and awaiting bills.

As you can see, we face challenges even when we are not together. As we move out of our summer of discontent and into the fall, with a school year of uncertainty, we wanted to bring you all up-to-date and ask that you revisit your pledge and remember even at a distance the plate still needs to be passed.

Thank you all for your continued financial support. We know with faith in God and guidance of the Holy Spirit we will make it through and continue to "Glorify God, Make Disciples and Meet Human Needs"

Almost every Sunday at 4 pm, a group of youth and adults get on Zoom to check in and talk about whatever comes up in the conversation. When we started in the spring, we were talking about how weird it was for everything to shut down, cancellations of milestone events, like graduations and end of year concerts, and the fact that none of our annual conferences or the mission trip would be happening this summer.

As time has progressed, we've shared stories about our baking adventures, gardening, popular memes, video games, and hope for the future. We've also talked about how hard this is for everyone: family trips cancelled, missing friends and families, summer traditions upended, and so on.

A request I have is that we pray for them. They, like many others, are struggling with the unknown of a new school year, mental health, confusion, and concern in a lack of coming together to get through this pandemic, and they miss their church families.

Presbyterian Women Horizons Bible Study

The 2020-2021 Presbyterian Women Horizons Bible Study, *Into the Light: Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament* will begin Wednesday, September 9 from 11 am until noon via Zoom. The login is listed on the APC website (apchumble.org) under "View Scheduled Live Stream Gatherings."

In this nine-lesson study, Lynn Miller revives lament as a proper theological response to the difficult situations of our world.

One of the foundational points of the study is that, in scripture, lament usually leads to hope. After crying out to God, the one who laments remembers God. And while that doesn't fix things in the moment - the injustice, the loss still exists - the lamenter is strengthened to face the world and to hope.

And for us, as Christians, hope is not just an emotional response or an attitude of pie in the sky. Hope implies movement: both God's inherent movement toward justice and our movement toward God. Recovering lament may be one of the church's most timely gifts to the world.





For Children and Adults!

I read this idea in Presbyterian Outlook and I thought it would be helpful to use with our children; I also feel it would be great for all of us to take the time to think about this message of thankfulness and gratitude.

For inspiration, use the words of Psalm 105:1-2 1 O give thanks to the Lord, call on his name, make known his deeds among the peoples. 2 Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wonderful works.

Share with your children that like us, God loves receiving our gratitude. It would be great if we all, adults and children, thought about God and gratitude. The Psalm tells us not just to "give thanks to the Lord," but also to make God's deeds known among the peoples. Select a few ideas you have thought about and do one or both of the following ideas.

- Window signs: Gather sheets of paper, crayons or markers, and clear tape. Ask your children to write or draw pictures of what they are grateful to God for. Encourage them to make their letters or pictures large. Tape the completed pictures to the windows of your home. Make sure they are facing outward so those passing by will see them.
- Sidewalk chalk: If you have sidewalk in front of your home, ask your children to write or draw pictures of what they are grateful to God for. Let them know they are sharing their thanks not only with God, but are also letting all those who pass by your home see the goodness of God.

What great ways to let others know how we appreciate our blessings and also a good opportunity for us to think about those things for which we are grateful. *Pastor Jackie*

Sunday Worship on BoxCast

Using chat, watching on your big screen, and interesting info

By now, most of us have figured out how to watch Sunday morning worship on BoxCast. If you haven't, please contact Forrest Craig at fcraig3@gmail.com or 785-633-2994 for assistance.

Thank you for your patience as we moved to BoxCast. With some generous donations, we have been able to make major upgrades to our equipment to provide a superior live stream broadcast. As is often the case, though, implementing upgrades reveals weaknesses in unexpected places. Most notably was the intermittent failure of an Ethernet switch, a simple device for splitting an internet signal between multiple devices, which led to postponing August 16 worship while we scrambled to locate the cause of the internet loss and how to work around it. With a replacement switch and a new computer, we had a flawless broadcast on August 23 and we're comfortable that high quality BoxCast broadcasts are here to stay.

Using Chat - Please use the chat box on the Live Stream page of the website (apchumble.org/live) to register your attendance. Note that there's no "Send" button...just hit "enter" or "return" on your keyboard to send what you've typed. You can also use the chat window to submit your prayer concerns or other information. Be aware that all viewers of the chat screen will see your messages.

Watch on your TV - BoxCast reports that most of us watch on desktop computers. Did you know that you can also watch on your big screen TV if you have a smart TV, Roku, Apple TV, or FireStick? Here's how:

Roku - Turn on Roku, scroll to Search, type in "BoxCast," add Channel, go back to Home, select "BoxCast," select "Find an Organization," type "Atascocita," and then select. Scroll through upcoming and previously recorded broadcasts.

Apple TV - Turn on Apple TV, search for "BoxCast" channel, search for "Atascocita," add to Favorites, and scroll through upcoming and previously recorded broadcasts.

Amazon FireTV Stick - Turn on Amazon FireTV Stick, search for "BoxCast" channel, search for "Atascocita," and scroll through upcoming and previously recorded broadcasts.


Let your creativity flow and enjoy the symbol of the rock reminding us of Jesus - our very real foundation for our faith.
