# This Month from Pastor Wayne My Cup Runneth Over

The Gospel of John introduces us to Jesus by saying, "From the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another." (John 1:16) That verse hit home with me recently. Each time I would enter the church and head to my office, I would pass by the HAAM box, where we were collecting groceries as a back-to-school project for families. On Monday, there were three bags. Someone added three more. Another four arrived. By the middle of the week we were getting close to twenty bags. Finally, I posted on social media about the great response, as by the end of the week nearly 50 bags had been donated. With donated money, we actually surpassed the 50 bag goal George Williams had set for the church. Each bag of groceries had cans of soup, vegetables, boxes of cereal, and bags of rice. I just imagined, when the bags from APC were delivered to HAAM and unloaded by their staff the joy that must have come from seeing how God had provided one blessing after another.

Things felt a little bare at church after the groceries had been picked up by HAAM. And then I noticed something I had missed as the grocery bags occupied my full attention. The box that holds bedding supplies for Sleep in Heavenly Peace had miraculously filled up. Pillows and mattresses and sheets were piled high as God provided one blessing after another.

I am offering a new Bible study this fall, the Disciple Bible Study. We will meet at noon on Wednesdays. When I publicized the course, the number 12 came to my mind. Jesus had twelve disciples, and I hoped and prayed we might have 12 earnest students join the study. Well, I had to expand my expectations as a whole page of names filled our first sign-up sheet. At last tally, there are now 32 disciples signed up for our Disciple Bible Study. With each new name, I give thanks to Jesus Christ, who from the fullness of his grace provides one blessing after another

We put out the word we wanted to send a team to North Carolina to help with the recovery from Hurricane Helene. Right now we have 19 on the list. The needs are great in North Carolina, and we are glad we can do our part in helping folks in their recovery. We hope we will be a blessing as we come alongside and offer our assistance. And yet if you have ever been part of this type of a mission trip experience, the blessing flows both ways. You can expect to hear stories upon our return that from the fullness of God's grace, we who went to serve received one blessing after another.

Sunday mornings have brought a wonderful blessing this summer as a small group of intergenerational participants, adults and children, have joined in a study based upon the children's program Bluey. We have talked and shared our feelings about worry, forgiveness, friendship, and many other helpful topics. One Sunday, Katie Hannan, our class leader, set up a small obstacle course in Fellowship Hall. Then all of us adults took a turn at the beginning of the course. It appeared it would be a simple task to navigate the obstacles...until Katie told us we had to close our eyes. With eyes closed, we then were instructed by the children where to move our feet, warned when we were in danger of bumping into something or stepping outside the lines, and enthusiastically guided until we safely reached our destination. Children and adults together, working together, learning together, laughing together, and solving problems together...oh yes, one blessing after another.
