## This Month from Pastor Wayne Providence

I came across a helpful explanation of the word providence many years ago in the Horizons Bible Study for Presbyterian Women: "Providence is derived from the Latin pro video, to see beforehand, denoting the foresight of God." One of the great comforts of the Christian faith is that God is providential—able to see forward, able to map out a plan for all creation.

Despite the claims of fortune tellers and psychics, being able to see forward is not part of our human makeup. We face the future with uncertainty, not knowing what each day will hold. In a world of wars, threats of terrorism, reports of cruelty and vicious attacks on the nightly news, and the everyday fears that confront us, we might long for the ability of pro video—to see beforehand.

But providence as pro video is not our possession. Providence as pro video, seeing beforehand, belongs to God. That same Horizons Bible Study suggested that our experience of providence actually comes from seeing backward: "From our human perspective, providence means being able to look back and say with confidence, 'God has seen to it."

The biblical story of Joseph and his brothers illustrates this understanding of providence. Rejected and betrayed by his brothers, Joseph endures slavery, imprisonment, and exile. Yet when it is all said and done, he could look back on his strange and difficult journey and see God's hand at work all along the way. Joseph walked forward into the darkness, not knowing what was before him. Later, he recognized that God had been going ahead of him, preparing a way and working out a plan.

If you have concerns and fears about the future, I offer you this: not the ability or assurance that we know what the future holds, but rather the assurance and comfort that we know the One who holds the future. We cannot see forward. But, wonder of wonders, we can look back.

### **Providence by Pastor Wayne**

In your concern for the future, look back and see what God has done. See the loosened chains of a people set free from slavery, the waters pushed to the side of the Red Sea, and the manna and quail scattered generously along the desert route. Look back and see a manger, claiming again the good news that our God is *Emmanuel*, the God who is with His children. See the hands of Jesus, hands that were not repulsed by human sickness, weakness, suffering, or sin. See how the hands of Jesus reached out and gave the touch of love and healing to all. Look back and see the cross and the empty tomb, the theater where God won the greatest of victories: conquering sin, death, and all the powers of evil.

Look back and know that every one of God's promises has been answered with a loud AMEN through the person of Jesus Christ. Look back and see that God, true to His word, never leaves nor forsakes his children.

Look back and see how God has provided. Look back and see the providence of God. Then look forward. We cannot see the future. We cannot know the future. But we can trust the One who does know the future. To trust in God's providence is to have faith.

The scriptures tell us faith is "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." May we live today as people of faith, people whose faith is placed squarely on the shoulders of our loving God. Although we cannot see the future, we can see the past. God is faithful. So put your trust in God. Trust God's plan. Trust God's purpose. Trust God's providence. God will provide.


